## Anti-Bullying Week and 'Dress to Express' Day

This week is National Anti-Bullying Week and in school we have had an Anti-Bullying focus. The theme of Anti-Bullying Week this year is 'Reach Out', and on Tuesday our School Council led an assembly showing children how to recognise bullying behaviour, look after each other and reach out for help when needed. Incidents of bullying are very rare in school, however it is important that we give the children the skills to take action, now or in the future. The children were reminded that they should talk to any 'trusted adult' in school and that the adults will listen and help.

In school, throughout the year, we foster a culture, based on our School Values, where everyone is unique, special and respected. We are a wonderfully diverse school community and we encourage our children to be proud of their differences.

To celebrate this, on Friday 25th November, the School Council are organising a 'Dress to Express' Day where children can come into school dressed in something that expresses their personality. This could be a favourite sports kit, clothing from countries of origin, a favourite colour, even pyjamas! For one day only, anything goes, and if your child feels most comfortable in their school uniform, this is fine too! Instead of bringing in a donation to charity on this day, we are asking for donations of items of food for the Christmas hampers which will be prizes at the Christmas Morning. This could be wine, mince pies, crackers, jams, chutney, Christmas pudding, chocolates and biscuits.

Following on from Anti-Bullying Week we will be involving the children in updating our Anti-Bullying policy which will also be shared with parents. Anti-Bullying themes are also included within our Relationship and Health Education lessons throughout the year.
