Sporting highlights this week from Mr Sagar

St Elizabeth's sports teams had a fortnight to remember. After a quiet start to the term, the last two weeks saw: four league fixtures, two Borough Football Tournaments, the Borough Cross Country and two boys representing the Richmond Cross Country Team in the London Youth Games.

The Rugby Team started the impressive start to the year with a 7 -1 victory over Holy Trinity. Next was the Netball Club, who played a league and a friendly game against Holy Trinity. St Elizabeth's won the league game 21-1 and the friendly game 13-0. The boys' Football Team opened their league season with a robust 11 -1 over the Russell School. Nyore scored a magnificent five goals whilst the girls' team fought bravely but lost to a talented Russell School team.

Rory and Charlie in Y6 represented Team Richmond in the London Youth Games Cross Country Competition. The under 11 boys' team finished an impressive 2nd and Team Richmond finished 3rd overall, earning the boys bronze medals. Well done boys!

The Richmond Borough Cross Country Competition was held in Richmond Park this morning. Our team performed well, with some great individual runs. We look forward to receiving the results.

Finally, St Elizabeth's had a historic cup run to be crowned Boys' Borough Football Tournament Champions. Forty schools from across the borough took part in this highly contested competition. In the morning part of the competition, the boys topped their group with three wins and a draw. In the afternoon they were in a league with the other top placed teams and managed to win two games and draw one. This put them in the semi-finals against St Edmund's. Despite trailing 1:0 at half time, the boys showed courage and perseverance to win 2 - 1. The final was a tense affair but St Elizabeth's continued to play an attractive passing game and held onto a well-deserved 1:0 victory. An amazing achievement.

This has been an amazing few weeks of results and we are so proud of all our teams and the effort they put into their sport. Hopefully, this fantastic cup achievement will live long in the memories of the boys and serve to inspire all our children to take part in and enjoy sport.
