Cost of Living Support

The increase in the cost of living is having a wide impact on families. This can be especially hard at Christmas time. Richmond Council has a Cost of Living Hub on their website with useful information about support available in the local area as well as advice on reducing bills: <u>https://www.richmond.gov.uk/services/cost_of_living_hub</u>

Please do also contact the school in confidence if you would like to check if your child is eligible for Free School Meals or the Pupil Premium Grant.

Your child may be able to get free school meals if you receive any of the following:

- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)
- Working Tax Credit run-on paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit
- Universal Credit if you apply on or after 1 April 2018 your household income must be less than £7,400
 a year (after tax and not including any benefits you get)
