
The Pupil Chaplains support Mrs Diver every Tuesday leading the Gospel assembly.

During Lent we used the Lenten candelabra which consists of 6 candles for the 6 weeks of Lent. Each week we lit a candle as we journeyed through the season of Lent.



### Lenten Promises



During Lent, following on from the Gospel assemblies, the Pupil Chaplains asked the classes to make Lenten promises each week. These would be presented in assemblies every Tuesday and would be added to the cross made out of the trunk of our Christmas tree. Our

aim is that by the end of Lent, the bare cross will be colourful with our flowers that have the promises. Even when the week was over, we still were asked to follow the promise from the previous week.

As well as class, we had a school promise and that was to line up more quietly at the end of our Lunch and Break.



Finally, we created individual promises.

Through living out these Lenten Promises we are growing closer to Jesus.

The Pupil Chaplains want you to try and make a Lenten promise at home with your family that focuses

on something that will be of benefit to the whole family.

There is a famous prayer, written by St Teresa of Avila, which reminds us how Jesus wants us to continue his work through our words and actions.


Christ has no body now on earth but yours,
