Percussion	An instrument that has to be hit, scraped or shaken to produce sound
Glockenspiel	A tuned percussion instrument with METAL bars
Xylophone	A tuned percussion instrument with WOODEN bars
FACE in the space	A code used to work out the SPACE notes of the treble clef
Every Good Boy Deserves Football.	A code used to work out the LINE notes of the treble clef
Timbre	Tone Quality

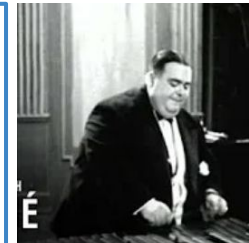
Wider listening
