Key words

20th century: the period between 01.01.1901 and 31.12.2000

21st century: the periods between 01.01.2001 and 31.12.2100

Artefact: an object made by a human being

Autobiography: a story of one's own life and achievements

Biography: a story of someone's life and achievements

Century: a period of one hundred years

Chronological Order: in order of time, from earliest to most recent

Curator: a keeper of a museum

Decade: a period of ten years

Document: a piece of writing

Exhibit: an item displayed in a museum

Hero: a person admired for their courage, achievements or noble qualities

Local: the surrounding area, or a person who lives there

Museum: a building that houses collections of interesting or important facts

Past: the time before now

Present: the current time we live in

Significant: important or remarkable

Timeline

28th July 1914
War breaks out.

25th March 1918
Walter Tull dies in battle in France.

11th November 1919
The first Remembrance Day is held.

July - November 1916
The Battle of the Somme. This battle was one of the deadliest battles of the First World War.

11th November 1918
The armistice is signed, ending the First World War.
