Review and organise sports club provision to increase range and availability of after / before school places. | £600 £500 | Increase the number of active hours of physical activity in break times and after school. Increase the number of club places and take up, especially reluctant children, Pupil Premium and SEND. |
| The profile of PESSPA being raised across the school | Formalise and provide structured non-curricular physical activity (equipment /rota's/ resource cards). This year's Sports Committee to focus on engaging years 5-1 with activities. | £150 | Increasing the focus on children - lead activities may increase uptake of physical activity. A combination of new playground equipment and children leading children will engage more children more of the time. |

| Broader experience of a range of sports and activities | Subscribing to the new scheme introduces 3 new sports in the autumn term and formalises the teaching of 2 more in the summer. | £600 | New sports will allow the pupils to develop basic physical skills and consolidate through a variety of sporting opportunities. |
