The Rosary



Pupil Chaplains explained that the Rosary is a special prayer that tells us about the life of Jesus and his Mother, Mary. The month of October is the month of the Rosary.

Bible Club



Pupil chaplains have led liturgies in Key Stage 1 to small groups of children on the miracle of loaves and fishes.

Pupil Chaplains read the story of Jesus performing one of his miracles, as he fed 5000 of his followers with only a few loaves of bread and fishes.

We discussed with the children how the story shows that sharing is important and we emphasised the importance of listening to Jesus and following Jesus' example.

We created their own age-appropriate follow up activities including dramatizing the story through other resources. Children also wrote thank you prayers.
