Atlas: a book of maps

Capital city: a city from where the country is ruled

Compass: a device that shows the directions north, east, south and west

Continent: a large solid area of land. Earth has seven continents. In order from largest to smallest, they are Asia, Africa, North America, South America, Antarctica, Europe, and Oceania

Country: a land with its own people, language and laws **Direction:** the way which something moves, lies or points **Land:** the dry part of the Earth not covered by water

Locate: to find

Season: the year is divided into four parts called seasons. The four seasons are spring,

summer, autumn and winter

Temperature: how hot or cold something is

Thermometer: an instrument to measure temperature

Weather: what it is like outside; rain, sunshine, storms and snow are different kinds of weather
