Liturgical/Prayer links

Prior knowledge

In Reception, children have learned that Pentecost is the time when we celebrate the Good News of Jesus.

Big Question

How does the Holy Spirit help and guide us in our lives?

To answer this question the children will use the knowledge learned within RE lessons and make links to the scripture that was used.

Learning about Religion

- Recognise religious stories.

Learning from Religion

- Say what they wonder about.
- Ask wondering questions about what Holy days and holidays.

Key words

Holiday: A time of leisure and relaxing.

Holyday: A day when a religious festival or holiday takes place

Apostles: The twelve close followers of Jesus

Help: to make something easier for someone by offering your services.

Pentecost: The 50th day after Easter, when the Holy Spirit descended onto the disciples

Promise: To assure someone that something will happen.

Holy Spirit: God's gift to people on earth

Guide: To show the way to others.

Resurrection: To come back from the dead

Alleluia: Praise God

Knowledge/Scripture/Liturgy:

For Christians, Sunday is the special day of the week. It is the day on which Jesus rose from the dead and is considered to be a day of rest. Pentecost is a special celebration of the gift of the Holy Spirit, through whom the risen life of Jesus is given.

- Children talk about their experience and feelings about holidays and say what they wonder about what makes a holiday a happy time.
- Children will recognise what a holy day is and the story of coming of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost.
- Children will be able to ask and respond to questions about the difference between ordinary days and holidays and why we have them.
- Children will be able to **retell** the story of the coming of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost.
- Children will understand the promise that Jesus made to his friends that he would send the Holy Spirit to help guide them and spread the Good News.
- Children will **learn** that Pentecost symbolises the birth of the Church.
- □ Some children will be able to **recognise** some symbols of the Holy Spirit.
- □ Some children will be able to **describe** the ways in which the Holy Spirit is a helper and guide.
- Children will celebrate their new knowledge and understanding by planning, leading and delivering their own end of topic liturgy.
