Learning about Religion

- ❑ Recognise religious stories.

Learning from Religion

- ❑ Talk about their own feelings, experiences and the things that matter to them.

Vocabulary

- ❑ **Family:** a group of people living together
- ❑ **Belong:** to be part of something
- ❑ **God:** creator of all
- ❑ **Love:** a feeling of deep affection
- ❑ **Care:** to provide what is necessary
- ❑ **Different:** not the same.
- ❑ **God's children:** followers of God
- ❑ **Psalm:** a sacred song or poem
- ❑ **Family of God:** being a Christian and a follower of Jesus means you are part of God's family
- ❑ **Response:** words spoken by people in a religious service

Knowledge/Scripture/Liturgy

This topic focuses on everyone belongs to the family of God. It is in the love of a family that most Christians first experience the reality of Church.

- ❑ Children will be able to **talk about** their experience and feelings about the roles of people within families.
- ❑ Children will explore the various ways that love and care are shown within the family
- ❑ Children will be able to **ask and respond to** questions about the difference between families.
- ❑ Through Psalm 150, Psalm 63 and Psalm 16, children will be able to **recognise** words and phrases which tell people what God is like.
- ❑ Children will **recognise** that God is a loving parent and He loves and cares for everyone.
- ❑ Children will **recognise** that Jesus was shown love and care in his family and that God is a loving parent and He loves and cares for everyone.
- ❑ Children will be able to **retell** some of the psalms and retell something about Jesus' childhood.
- ❑ Children will **recognise** that psalms are prayers that Jesus would have known and used, and that they tell us about God. Psalms also help us to pray and think about God.
- ❑ Children will **celebrate** their new knowledge and understanding by planning, leading and delivering their own end of topic liturgy.
