Knowledge Organiser Religion Year 5 Autumn Topic: Domestic Church - Family: Ourselves

Prior Learning

In Year 4 the children learned about the family of God in scripture. They learned about Jesus' family and Jesus' ancestry.

Big Question:

What makes me unique?

To answer this question the children will use the knowledge learned within RE lessons and make links to the scripture that was used.

Link to end of year descriptors:

Learning about religion

- Describe more complex scripture passages in a way that shows understanding of the scripture sources used.
- Show a knowledge and understanding of: a range of religious beliefs, the life and work of key figures in the history of the people of God.

Learning from religion

- Compare their own and other people's responses to questions

Vocabulary:

- **Qualities:** a distinctive characteristic.
- **Unique:** being one of a kind.
- Gifts: a natural ability or talent.
- **Challenge:** difficulties
- **Joys:** a feeling of happiness.
- Responsibility: duty to do something.
- **Dignity:** to be treated with honour and respect.
- Image: an exact representation of a person.



Knowledge/Scripture/Liturgy:

This topic focuses on each person is made in the image and likeness of God.

- Through researching a well-known figure whose qualities they admire,children will be able to make links between their beliefs about talents and qualities and how they use them and how it affects others.
- Using St. Paul's letter to the Colossians children will make links with scripture and explain how Christians are called to live in peace.
- Through Genesis children will identify the unique qualities God has given us and wants us to develop.
- Children will be able to describe and show an understanding of how the experience of being made in image and likeness of God influences their lives.
- Children will research the lives of significant Christians such as Maximilian Kolbe to learn how they were called to be like God and had the courage to use their qualities in the service of others.
- Through these examples children will begin to show understanding of how the call to be holy shapes life.
- □ Through Hosea children will identify the characteristics of 'God as a loving parent'.
- Children will celebrate their new knowledge and understanding by planning, leading and delivering their own end of topic liturgy.
