Prior Learning

Knowledge/Scripture/Liturgy:

This topic focuses on how through Baptism and Confirmation, all Christians are called to share the mission of Jesus. There are different ways of carrying out that mission. For some people their mission or vocation is as a priest or member of a religious order.

- Children will explore investigate the importance of commitment in everyday life.
- Through independent research children will show and make links **between** commitment to service and care of others are influenced beliefs and values.
- Through John 1:35-41 children will learn about the Baptism of Jesus and John's vocation and give reasons why Christians fulfil their baptismal promises by answering God's call through their chosen vocation in various ways, including the religious life.
- ☐ Children will be able, using a **developing religious vocabulary**, to **give reasons** for the signs and symbols used in the Sacrament of Holy Orders.
- ☐ Children will be able to **use religious terms** to **show an understanding** of prayers of consecration and vows made at ordination and profession.
- ☐ Through the special reflection written by St Henry Newman children will **explore** our mission as Christians in living out our baptismal vows.
- ☐ Children will **celebrate** their new knowledge and understanding by planning, leading and delivering their own end of topic liturgy.
