This term the pupil chaplains have been talking about the impact of climate change in assemblies.

On Friday 1st October the pupil chaplains launched the 'Go Green' challenge in assembly.



The pupil chaplains asked the children to wear green and to donate £1 to CAFOD.

All the money donated will be used to help people affected by climate change.

What is the Go Green Challenge?

This autumn, leading up to the COP26 climate talks in November, the pupil chaplains are asking pupils and families to 'Go Green'.

To 'Go Green' you need to do at least one of these things:

- Walking or cycling to school apart from a car.

- Going vegetarian for at least a meal each week
- Going plastic free

The pupil chaplains have asked the school to think in particular about one of these challenges...Reducing our use of single use plastic.

Pupil chaplains have challenged all children to reduce the use of single plastic by using a water-bottle made from metal or reusable plastic.

Using a water bottle that can be used lots of times reduces waste, is better for the environment and helps people who suffer as a result of climate change.

Each week the pupil chaplains are counting how many children have taken on board this challenge.
