Learning about Religion

- ❑ Show a knowledge and understanding of: a range of religious beliefs; the life and work of key figures in the history of the people of God; religious symbols and steps involved in age appropriate religious actions and worship and those actions of believers which arise as a consequence of their beliefs.

Learning from Religion

- ❑ Show an understanding of how their own and others' decisions are informed by beliefs and values.
- ❑ Make links to Scripture to support a point of view.

Mission: To carry out the work of God

Bishop: A senior member of the Christian clergy

Ecumenism: Aim of promoting unity among Christian churches

Cathedral: Principal church of a diocese

Apostle: A person sent on a mission to preach the Gospel

Disciple: A person committed to be a follower of Jesus

Good News: Gospel

Diocese: Area under authority of Bishop

Inspirational: To be creative and influential

Baptism: A ceremony in which a person becomes a follower of Jesus

Christian Unity: To unite Christian groups

Gentile: A person who is not Jewish

Knowledge/Scripture/Liturgy:

The Church, the Christian family, is made up of smaller Christian families called dioceses. Each diocese is led by a bishop.

- ❑ Children will **identify** inspirational communities (charities) in the local area and make links as to what inspires them.
- ❑ Children will begin to **show an understanding** of how their own and others' decisions in carrying out their mission in communities are informed by beliefs and values.
- ❑ Through scripture (Luke 4:14-22), the children will **recall and describe** how Jesus began his mission.
- ❑ Children will describe and make links with bishops continuing and sharing the work of the 12 apostles, and the mission of Jesus.
- ❑ Through the call of Levi, children **will research and describe** a person who carries out Jesus' mission today. Children will begin to **make links** between mission and one's beliefs and values.
- ❑ Children will **explore** the other Christian families which are not part of the Catholic Church to promote Jesus' final prayer that 'we all might be one' (John 17:11-12, 20-23; Corinthians 12:12-17, 21, 27). This promotion of Christian unity is called 'ecumenism'.
- ❑ Children will **research and compare** the different Christian communities, and will understand what unites or separates them.
- ❑ Children will **celebrate** their new knowledge and understanding by planning, leading and delivering their own end of topic liturgy.
