Prior knowledge

Big Question

Thank you: To appreciate, be grateful

Thanksgiving: A prayer or an expression of gratitude to God

Thoughtful: Showing consideration, being kind

Eucharist: The true presence of Jesus Christ, the Son of God, during Mass when the bread and wine become the body and blood of Jesus

Eucharistic prayer: The prayer said during the act of Eucharist

Host: Jesus' Body

Chalice: The cup holding Jesus' Blood

Knowledge/Scripture/Liturgy

The word Eucharist means 'thanksgiving'. The Eucharist is another name for the Mass. The parish family gathers to give thanks to God, most of all for the gift of Jesus, his Son.

- □ Children will **talk** about their experience of receiving and giving thanks and **explore** how others feel when they are thanked.
- Children will show how feelings and beliefs affect their behaviour with regard to giving thanks.
- Through Scripture (Luke 22:19-20), children will retell and describe what happens in the story of the Last Supper.
- □ Children will **name and recall** the 4 main parts involved in the Eucharist (Mass).
- Children will be able to recognise and say some words and responses that are said during Mass.
- Children will recognise, know and begin to describe some religious signs and symbols used in Mass; for example, that the bread and wine becomes the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ and begin to understand that is why Catholics give thanks.
- Children will be able to **describe** how Catholics try to live what they have experienced at Mass in their daily lives and continue Jesus' mission.
- Children will celebrate their new knowledge and understanding by planning, leading and delivering their own end of topic liturgy.
