Knowledge/Scripture/Liturgy

The Eucharist is a memorial sacrifice in the Jewish sense of remembering. It is a memorial of Christ's sacrifice on the cross, through which Christ gives his body and blood for the salvation of all people and provides hope for the future.

- ☐ Children will **compare** their own and others' ideas about what makes a particular memory significant and why words, symbols or actions might evoke it and realise some of these questions are difficult to answer.
- ☐ Children will **describe** and **make links**between the Passover in Exodus, the Last
 Supper and belief in the Eucharist using
 scripture from the Old Testament (Exodus
 13:3) and New Testament (Luke 22:14-20).
- ☐ Children will use a developing religious vocabulary to **give reasons** for religious actions and symbols connected to the Passover and the celebration of the Eucharist.
- ☐ Children will begin to **understand** that through Transubstantiation, the power of the Holy Spirit, transforms bread and wine into the Body and Blood of Christ
- Through studying the life of John Varnier and through independent research children will be able to **give reasons** for why believers follow the example of Jesus in his life of sacrifice
- Children will engage with and respond to questions of life choices in the light of religious teaching about sacrifice.
- ☐ Children will **celebrate** their new knowledge and understanding by planning, leading and delivering their own end of topic liturgy.
