Knowledge/Scripture/Liturgy

- ☐ Children will **identify** 'the gifts of the Holy Spirit' and begin to **show understanding** of the transforming power of the Holy Spirit and how it shapes the lives of Christians today.
- ☐ Children will begin to **engage with and respond** to questions about how the belief in the transforming power of the Spirit and the message expressed in Paul's letter give meaning and purpose to life.
- Children will **celebrate** their new knowledge and understanding by planning, leading and delivering their own end of topic liturgy.

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
