Knowledge/Scripture/Liturgy

Lent is a time to work at growing spiritually in preparation to celebrate the death of Jesus and his resurrection at Easter. This process involves growing in many ways. It is not always easy.

- ☐ Children will **explore**, **talk about** and **ask wondering questions** about their experience of 'growing'.
- Children will **recognise** that spring is a time when things begin to grow.
- ☐ Children will **recognise** that Lent is a time for growth. Lent is also a time to get ready to celebrate Jesus' new life.
- ☐ Children will **explore**, **talk about** and **recognise** the ways in which we can grow in love to be more like Jesus by praying, fasting and service.
- ☐ Children will **recognise** the stories of Good Friday and Easter Sunday. Good Friday is the day that Jesus died on the cross and Easter Sunday is when God his Father gave Jesus new life and he rose from the dead.
- ☐ Children will **recognise** the Cross, the words of the Sign of the Cross and the Easter Garden.
- Children will **celebrate** their new knowledge and understanding by planning, leading and delivering their own end of topic liturgy.
