Prior knowledge

Big Question

*What good and wrong choices have you made?
How did you feel?*

To answer this question the children will use the knowledge learned within RE lessons and make links to the scripture that was used.

Learning about Religion

- Recognise religious stories.

Key words

Choice: Choose between two or more possibilities

Happy: Feeling of pleasure

Sad: Feeling of being unhappy

Disappointed: Feeling of being displeased

Sorry: Feeling of regret

Forgive: To stop feeling angry or hurt

Rules: Instructions

Wrong: Not correct

Right: Correct

Feeling: An emotional state

Love: A feeling of deep affection

Knowledge/Scripture/Liturgy

For Christians, it is important to make choices in the light of our belief in a loving God. There are times when we need to acknowledge our sorrow for making wrong choices. The Church offers the Sacrament of Reconciliation, which celebrates God's unconditional love for us.

- Children will **explore and talk about** the choices they make in their daily life.
- Children will **recognise and talk about** the consequences of the choices they make - some choices are good and some are not.
- Based on scripture, Luke 5:27-31, children will **retell** this story and **recognise** that Jesus helps us when we make the wrong choices through the story of Levi.
- Based on Luke 19:1-10, children will **recognise** that Jesus forgives us when we make the wrong choice using the example of Zacchaeus.
- Children will begin to **describe** ways in which people say sorry and forgive each other because they follow Jesus.
- Children will **know and understand** that it is good to say sorry. They will also learn a sorry prayer.
- Through John 13:34-35, children will **understand** that we are happy when we love each other and that this is recognised through the Sign of Peace at Mass
- Children will **celebrate** their new knowledge and understanding by planning, leading and delivering their own end of topic liturgy.
