Prior knowledge

In Year 1, the children learned God helps us to choose well and to be sorry. God forgives us.

Liturgical/Prayer links

- Act of sorrow
- The Sign of Peace

Big Question

Why are rules important? Why is it good to say sorry?

To answer this question the children will use the knowledge learned within RE lessons and make links to the scripture that was used.

Learning about Religion

- Retell, in any form, a narrative that corresponds to the scripture source used.
- Describe some of the actions and choices of believers that arise because of their faith.
- Describe some religious symbols and steps involved in religious actions and worship, including the celebration of the sacraments: Sacrament of Reconciliation

Learning about Religion

- Ask and respond to questions about their own and others' feelings, experiences and things that matter to them.
- Participate in periods of reflection in response to given stimulus.

Key words

Rules: Instructions

Safe: Protected

Sorry: Feeling sad; feeling regret

Forgive: Stop feeling angry

Right: True, correct

Wrong: Not correct, not true

Make up: Become friends again

Choices: Choose between two or more possibilities

Sin: Making a harmful choice

Consequence: Result of choice made

Examination of conscience: Think about the appropriateness of choices made

Knowledge/Scripture/Liturgy

For the Christian, Christ's rule of love of God and neighbour offers freedom and happiness. The exercise of the conscience enables the Christian to follow God's law and through love to express sorrow for wrongdoing. The Sacrament of Reconciliation grants pardon and peace.

- Children will **talk** about their own experience and feelings about rules in their life.
- Based on Matthew 18:21-22, children will be able to **recognise and retell** the story of Peter asking Jesus about forgiveness as a religious story.
- Children will **recognise and describe** that people say sorry and ask forgiveness because they are followers of Jesus.
- Children will **recognise** some religious words and signs that Christians use to express sorrow and forgiveness: sorry, Sign of Peace.
- Children will use religious words and phrases to **describe** the examination of conscience.
- Children will **describe** some aspects of the Sacrament of Reconciliation: repentance, disclosure of sin, absolution and reparation.
- Children **describe** how Christians try to practise Jesus' commandment of love, peace and reconciliation. This is evident when the Sign of Peace is offered at Mass.
- Children will **celebrate** their new knowledge and understanding by planning, leading and delivering their own end of topic liturgy.
