Learning about Religion

- Describe more complex scripture passages in a way that shows understanding of the scripture sources used.
- Show a knowledge and understanding of; a range of religious beliefs, the life and work of key figures in the history of the people of God,- Moses.
- Know religious symbols and steps involved in age appropriate religious actions and worship: Sacrament of Reconciliation.

Learning from Religion

- Show an understanding of how their own and others' decisions are informed by beliefs and values.

Key words

Freedom: Being free to act or move as one wishes

Responsibility: Doing the things you are expected to do and accepting the consequences of your actions

Beatitudes: The teachings from Jesus' Sermon on the Mount

Commandments: 10 rules for life given by God in the Bible

Reconciliation: Becoming friendly again after a disagreement

Knowledge/Scripture/Liturgy

Christians believe that God has given each person the free will and power to choose. The gift of God's Spirit is the foundation of Christian faith and the holiness of conscience. The creative interplay of freedom and responsibility informs the life of the community of believers, the Church.

- Children will **explore and make links** between children's/people's ideas and questions concerning freedom and the choices they make in their daily life. Children will **compare** these.
- Children will know some of the Ten Commandments, and **make links** between the stories of the Ten Commandments and The Beatitudes.
- Children will begin to make **give reasons** about how believers' decisions are influenced by their beliefs.
- Children will **link** these to living freely and the responsibility this brings and how living by God's law shapes our lives.
- Children **describe, understand** and **give reasons** why believers choose to live by God's law and through scripture.
- Children will **understand** the importance of the Sacrament of Reconciliation in mending our relationships with God and others.
- Children will **celebrate** their new knowledge and understanding by planning, leading and delivering their own end of topic liturgy.
