Prior knowledge

In Year 5, children learned that Lent is a time of giving in preparation for the celebration of the sacrifice of Jesus.

Big Question

Why does loss and death bring about change?

To answer this question the children will use the knowledge learned within RE lessons and make links to the scripture that was used.

Knowledge/Scripture/Liturgy:

For Christians, it is through the life, death and resurrection of Jesus that new life begins. He reveals the way to eternal life for us and so a new life begins here and now, a life which will culminate in future glory. The Lenten journey is one which takes us to the glory of Easter Sunday, from death to new life.

- Children will be able to make links to show how feelings and beliefs about loss and death affect their behaviour and that of others.
- Children will describe, understand and make links between Scripture and belief in the Resurrection of Jesus (Focus on John's Gospel).
- Children will be able to describe and show understanding of religious sources, beliefs, ideas, feelings and experiences connected with Lent, Good Friday of the Passion of the Lord; and The Easter Vigil in the Holy Night; making links between them.
- Children will use a variety of religious terms, actions and symbols accurately to show an understanding of different liturgies associated with the above.
- □ Children will be able to give **reasons** for certain actions by believers during Lent.
- Children will be able to engage with and respond to questions about death and new life in the light of religious teaching.
- Children will **celebrate** their new knowledge and understanding by planning, leading and delivering their own end of topic liturgy.
