### Prior knowledge

In Year 5, children learned that the Ten Commandments are God's rules for living responsibly.

*To answer this question the children will use the knowledge learned within RE lessons and make links to the scripture that was used.*

### Key words

**Care:** Look after and provide for

**Sickness:** Illness

**Hospice:** A home providing care for the sick or terminally ill

**Compassion:** Having a strong desire to help others in need

**Sacrament:** A Christian religious act or ceremony that is considered especially sacred

**Anointing:** Covering with oil as part of a religious ceremony

**Sin:** To do something that breaks religious law or is bad

**Forgiveness:**

**Parable:** A simple story with a moral or a story told to teach a lesson

**Lourdes:** The place where special spring water can heal the sick

**Responsibility:** Being dependable, making good choices and taking accountability for your actions

### Knowledge/Scripture/Liturgy

The Church believes that the anointing of the sick is one of the seven sacraments. It is intended to strengthen those who are ill.

- Children will **make links** between how people's beliefs and feelings about sickness affects their behaviour.
- Through Luke 18:35-43 and Luke 10:30-37, children will **make links** between caring for those in need is a Christian responsibility.
- Some children will be able to show **understanding** of how religious belief shapes life - children will research those who care and why.
- Children will **understand** and know that the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick occurs during Mass, as well as at home or in a hospital.
- Children will **identify and give reasons** for some of the religious actions and symbols; for example, anointing with oil
- Children will **show an understanding** of the different liturgies (three Sacraments) a dying person might receive: the Sacrament of Reconciliation, the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick and Holy Communion.
- Children will **learn and explain why** Lourdes is a place of healing through the story of Mary appearing to Bernadette and that people make this pilgrimage because of their beliefs.
- Children will **celebrate** their new knowledge and understanding by planning, leading and delivering their own end of topic liturgy.
