# Knowledge/Scripture/Liturgy

The Church believes that the anointing of the sick is one of the seven sacraments. It is intended to strengthen those who are ill.

- ☐ Children will **make links** between how people's beliefs and feelings about sickness affects their behaviour.
- ☐ Through Luke 18:35-43 and Luke 10:30-37, children will **make links** between caring for those in need is a Christian responsibility.
- Some children will be able to show understanding of how religious belief shapes life children will research those who care and why.
- ☐ Children will **understand** and know that the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick occurs during Mass, as well as at home or in a hospital.
- Children will identify and give reasons for some of the religious actions and symbols; for example, anointing with oil
- ☐ Children will **show an understanding** of the different liturgies (three Sacraments) a dying person might receive: the Sacrament of Reconciliation, the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick and Holy Communion.
- Children will learn and explain why Lourdes is a place of healing through the story of Mary appearing to Bernadette and that people make this pilgrimage because of their beliefs.
- ☐ Children will **celebrate** their new knowledge and understanding by planning, leading and delivering their own end of topic liturgy.
