Prior knowledge

Sign of the Cross: A Christian action forming a cross shape with your hand. It can be part of a prayer or a blessing Belong: To be part of Friends: A person you have a bond with Sacrament: A special rite Invitation: Inviting someone to do something **Reply:** To respond Accept: To say yes Welcome: To greet someone Baptism: The first of the 7 sacraments, when a child or person becomes a follower of Jesus Godparent: The witness of a child's Baptism, who will support the child in his/her faith journey Sign: Object/gesture that conveys information and meaning

Knowledge/Scripture/Liturgy

This topic focuses on Baptism enabling people to belong to God's family in a special way. Christians believe that everyone is invited to share in the life and work of God through Baptism.

- Children will explore and talk about their experience of belonging to different groups - swimming, football, Beavers, Rainbows etc.
- Through Mark 10:13-16, children will recognise that Jesus loves us and that Baptism is an invitation to belong to the family of the Church.
- Children will begin to retell and describe some of the actions and symbols used within the Rite of Baptism - sign of the cross, role of parents and Godparents, symbols used (holy water, white garment, candle), and the prayer, Our Father.
- Children will be able to recall and use religious words and phrases associated with the pouring of water, anointing with oil, lighting the baptismal candle etc.
- Children will celebrate their new knowledge and understanding by planning, leading and delivering their own end of topic liturgy.
