## **Key words**

Advent: The time of year before

birthday.

## Knowledge/Scripture/Liturgy

In this topic, children will explore how God had prepared His people for the coming of His Son, the Messiah, over many hundreds of years. Advent is a time of preparation to celebrate Jesus' first coming on earth. It also reminds people that He will come again at the end of time.

- ☐ Children will **explore and discuss** how they prepare for special occasions e.g. a party, holiday etc.
- ☐ Children will **ask and respond** to their own and others' experiences and feelings about how important it is to prepare well and what happens if there is no preparation.
- ☐ Children will use religious words and phrases to describe some religious actions and symbols connected with the liturgical season of Advent; for example that Advent consists of four weeks of preparing. They will also recognise and understand the symbolism of the Advent wreath.
- ☐ Children will **retell** that Isaiah (9:2-6) told the people of God's promise to send them His son.
- Through the Gospels, children will retell key events of the story of the Annunciation, the story of the Visitation and the story of the birth of Baby Jesus.
- ☐ Children will **describe** how Christians follow Jesus as the Light of the World and how they live this out in their lives.
- ☐ Children will **celebrate** their new knowledge and understanding by planning, leading and delivering their own end of topic liturgy.
