Big Question

Chosen people: People who have been chosen by God for holy purposes Roots: Where a person comes from

Family tree: A chart showing all the people in a family over many generations, and how they are related to one another

Genealogy: The study of family lines of ancestors

Knowledge/Scripture/Liturgy

This topic focuses on how Jesus' family tree helps us to understand how Jesus had a family like our own and that members from this family tree lead and help to guide Christians' beliefs.

- Children will compare, ask and respond to questions about their own and others' experiences and feelings about tracking back family trees.
- Through Matthew 1:1-17, children will describe and show understanding of some of the important people in the genealogy of Jesus' family.
- Through Genesis 12:1-18, children will retell the story of Abraham and Jacob and make links between their belief in God and how they behaved.
- Children will **research** the lives of other significant people in Jesus' family tree.
- Through The Book of Ruth, children will give reasons for Ruth's actions and how she lived out her life.
- Children will be able to describe and show understanding of what Christians believe about how God leads and guides their lives.
- Children will **celebrate** their new knowledge and understanding by planning, leading and delivering their own end of topic liturgy.
