# Knowledge/Scripture/Liturgy

This topic focuses on Advent as a time of preparation for Jesus' birth and encourages believers to prepare for the Christ who comes each day.

- Children will make links and show understanding of how their own and others' decisions about how they wait and hope are informed by beliefs and values.
- Children will use developing religious vocabulary to give reasons for the religious actions and symbols connected with the liturgical season of Advent; for example, the symbolism of the Advent Wreath.
- Children will make links between scripture texts showing how the people of God waited purposefully with hope, for the Messiah and how Christians today hope to welcome Christ at Christmas and at the second coming (Isaiah and Jeremiah).
- Through The Annunciation and The Visitation children will make links to how Mary waited in joyful hope for the birth of her son Jesus.
- Children will compare some of the Gospel stories that tell of Jesus' birth (Matthew and Luke's Gospels).
- Children will celebrate their new knowledge and understanding by planning, leading and delivering their own end of topic liturgy.
