### Prior knowledge

### Big Question

*Why are loyalty and commitment important in relationships?*

*To answer this question the children will use the knowledge learned within RE lessons and make links to the scripture that was used.*

#### Learning about religion

### Key words

**Vocation:** A call from God to a holy state of life

**Marriage:** A covenant through which two people come together for their whole life

**Service:** Doing your religious duty towards God

**Responsibility:** Doing what is morally right

**Fidelity:** Loyalty

**Commitment:** A promise to do something

### Knowledge/Scripture/Liturgy

This topic focuses on how through the sacraments a Christian is called to a life of holiness and to the mission of spreading the Good News. This mission can be lived in different ways.

- ❑ Children will **begin to engage with** and respond to questions of life, particularly about commitment in their friendships.
- ❑ Through St Paul, children will **show understanding** that there are different ways of living our mission; for some it will be through marriage.
- ❑ Whatever life choices are made, children will **learn** that a Christian is called to a commitment of holiness and service of others.
- ❑ Children will be able to use a **developing religious vocabulary to give reasons** for the religious actions and symbols used in the Sacrament of Marriage including the symbolic meaning of the promises made between the married couple and God's everlasting love through the blessing of the rings.
- ❑ Through the Beatitudes in the Gospel of Matthew (5:6-9), children will **make links as to** how feelings and beliefs affect their behaviour and that of others, concerning their mission in life.
- ❑ Children will **research** examples of Christian witness of service in the local community through volunteering.
- ❑ Children will **celebrate** their new knowledge and understanding by planning, leading and delivering their own end of topic liturgy.
