- Children will be able to use a **developing**religious vocabulary to give reasons for the
 religious actions and symbols used in the
 Sacrament of Marriage including the symbolic
 meaning of the promises made between the
 married couple and God's everlasting love
 through the blessing of the rings.
- ☐ Through the Beatitudes in the Gospel of Matthew (5:6-9), children will **make links as to** how feelings and beliefs affect their behaviour and that of others, concerning their mission in life.
- ☐ Children will **research** examples of Christian witness of service in the local community through volunteering.
- ☐ Children will **celebrate** their new knowledge and understanding by planning, leading and delivering their own end of topic liturgy.
