Knowledge Organiser Religious Education Year 6 Autumn Advent/Christmas - Loving: Expectations





Liturgical/Prayer links

Prior knowledge

In Year 5 children learned that Advent is the season of waiting in joyful hope for the coming of Jesus, the Promised One, at Christmas and at the end of time.

Big Question

Why is it good to have high expectations of yourself and others?

To answer this question the children will use the knowledge learned within RE lessons and make links to the scripture that was used.

Link to end of year descriptors

Learning about religion

- Demonstrate a knowledge and understanding of: doctrine, belief and theological concepts, the nature, structure and authority of communities of beliefs, both locally and universally.
- Explain meaning and purpose of complex scripture passages in a way that shows understanding of the scripture source used.

Key words

Expectation: Looking forward to or waiting for something **Certainty:** Being sure

Advent: The period before Christmas where Christians wait for the coming of Jesus

Christmas: A Christian holiday which celebrates the birth of Jesus

Emmanuel: Hebrew for 'God is with us' **Angelus:** A devotion that

commemorates the Incarnation and is said in the morning, noon and evening **Incarnation:** Belief that Jesus is God in human form

Knowledge/Scripture/Liturgy

This topic focuses on the birth of Jesus as a sign and expression of God's love. Advent is a time of joyful expectation, as we prepare to receive Jesus into our lives and to share this gift with others at Christmas and throughout the year.

- Children will show an understanding of how their own and others' decisions concerning expectations are informed by beliefs and values.
- □ Children will **explore** the meaning of expectation in their life what do they expect of themselves?
- Children will be able to make links between scripture of religious belief in Advent as a time of joyful expectation; for example, through Isaiah 62:11-12 children will make links between the prophecy of expectation of the Messiah and the meaning of Advent.
- Children will know and show an understanding of the Annunciation and the Angelus.
- Children will show an understanding of the meaning of Incarnation and Jesus as the 'Word' in John's Gospel (1:14-18).
- Through Mark 1:1-5, children will make links between John the Baptist's expectation of Jesus and the understanding that Christ will come again.
- Children will celebrate their new knowledge and understanding by planning, leading and delivering their own end of topic liturgy.
