Dear Parents and Carers.

We have had great fun celebrating the Queen's 70th Jubilee in school today. We began with an assembly where the children learnt about the changes in the UK over the Queen's seventy year reign. The children also considered how being a monarch was both a very rewarding and challenging role and how the Queen was a model of our school value of 'Service'.

At lunch time today we had a whole school street party with staff and pupils eating lunch outside and enjoying a whole school playtime with music and bunting. The highlight was the staff musical chairs game which was won by Mrs FitzGerald in a very close fought competition!

Our Y6 children and parents have been busy this afternoon baking scones for the Jubilee Cream Tea. This is a lovely way to finish our Jubilee celebrations and also raise money for the Y6 end of year activities. Thank you to the Y6 parents for organising this.

Yesterday our children in Y3 to Y6 attended the Ascension Day Mass at Our Lady Queen of Peace Church. It was lovely to be able to celebrate with the parish once again. All the children sang beautifully and we have been delighted to hear from parishioners who valued the children being there. Thank you to Mgr Bill and the parish for their warm welcome.

We have also attached with this ParentMail a letter from Archbishop John which contains an invitation for those who have not been attending Mass during the Covid pandemic to return to our parishes for Sunday Masses. As of Sunday 5th June, the Bishops of England and Wales have re-instated the Sunday Obligation.
