Dear Parents and Carers,

We have many highlights this week and we are pleased to share these with you in this week's update.

It was so lovely to be able to welcome our Reception and Y1 parents into school this week for their class concerts with Mrs FitzGerald. These concerts are an opportunity to see a 'Music lesson in action' and show what our KS1 children have been learning in Music lessons this year. We are looking forward to our Y2 class concert next week on Friday 25th March.

As part of our learning in History and Geography, we are arranging local educational visits for some of our year groups so that children can explore and learn about the area in which they live and come to school. This week, as part of their topic 'Where does our food come from?', our Y2 children walked to Richmond town centre to purchase foods from around the world.

As part of their research project into the history of our school, our Y4 pupils visited the original site of St Elizabeth's School which was located there until 1969 when St Elizabeth's moved to Queen's Road.

This afternoon, our Y6 pupils are taking part in the Junior Citizen Event at Holly Lodge in Richmond Park. This is a Borough wide event for all children in Y6 to experience how to respond to different scenarios and situations they may face. It is an invaluable learning opportunity that helps our Y6 pupils develop some of the life skills they will need as they prepare to move onto secondary school.

Praying for the People of Ukraine and for Peace in the World

In our assemblies and classes this week, we have been praying for the people of Ukraine and for peace in the world. Our children are showing great kindness and awareness for those in need and have said that they would like to do something to help Ukrainian families. The school chaplains will be organising a 'Day for Peace' on Thursday 24th March with a focus on praying for peace, celebrating the many cultures within our school community and raising money for the DEC. The school chaplains with be sending more information about our 'Day for Peace' next week.

We are aware that some children may be experiencing anxiety about the situation in Ukraine and we know that all children will have very different levels of knowledge and understanding. We are especially aware that some of our families may be directly affected in different ways. We continue to encourage children to talk to their class teacher or any adult in school if they want to ask a question or feel worried in any way.

If you have any particular concerns or wish to share something with school, please do not hesitate to speak with your child's classteacher, and this can be arranged through the school office.

We are very pleased that we have been able to return to face to face Parents' Meetings this term with the opportunity for parents to see some of their child's work. Dr Stannard, our Chair of Governors, as well as members of our school governing body will also be in attendance and look forward to meeting and speaking with parents to gain their views.
