Dear Parents and Carers,

This week ..

As we shared in our Weekly Update last week, throughout the month of January we are continuing to set whole school New Year's Resolutions, which all have a focus on words.

This week in assemblies we have been exploring the impact of the words we use towards each other, looking at words that harm and words that heal. Children have been set the challenge to only use kind words which value and include others. You can support your child at home in this by encouraging them to say 'please', 'thank you', 'I'm sorry', 'after you' and other kind words.

We are already noticing an improvement in our children's confidence in trying to speak in complete sentences and learning new vocabulary, which were our New Year's Resolutions of last week, so thank you for your support in encouraging your child in this.

Our KS2 children have been delighted this week by the addition of new toys and games for use at playtimes. These toys were suggested by the children themselves and include a wide variety of fun games including giant Jenga blocks, playground dominoes, balance boards and plenty of throwing and catching games. We have also introduced a rota for class football games to provide space on the astro pitch for a greater variety of activities. A huge thank you to the PTA for providing the funds for these new playground resources for all the KS2 children! We are currently looking for new resources for the KS1 playground and look forward to introducing these soon.

On Tuesday this week, children in Y2, Y3 and Y6 took part in a cricket coaching session by Middlesex County Cricket. This was a fantastic opportunity for the children to try a new sport and learn new skills. We hope to be able to invite Middlesex County Cricket back to school again soon for other year groups to take part.

Finally this week, well done to our Y2 children who successfully completed their scooter safety training this week by the London Borough.
